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WHAT IS HOSPICE?

Hospice is a philosophy and a concept, not a specific place of care. Hospice care is for any person who has terminal illness or when curative treatment is no longer effective.

- Hospice Care focuses on enhancing the quality of life for the patient and loved ones.
- Hospice Care offers palliative and comfort care to patients by using the most methods of pain and symptom management.
- Hospice Care provides care 24 Hours a day, seven days a week.
- Hospice Care involves a team of professionals and volunteers who address the physical, emotional, social and spiritual needs of the patient and family.



At New Hope Hospice Care patients are cared for by an interdisciplinary team of professionals.

HOSPICE MEDICAL DIRECTOR

The hospice medical director oversees the medical aspects of patient care, provides guidance to the interdisciplinary team, and ensures that care plans align with hospice philosophy and standards.

ATTENDING PHYSICIAN

The attending physician is directly involved in the day-to-day medical management of patients, including making decisions about medications, treatments, and interventions to optimize comfort and quality of life.

REGISTERED NURSE

Registered Nurses in hospice care often serve as case managers, providing comprehensive care to patients and their families. They assess patient conditions, manage symptoms, educate patients and families about care options, and offer emotional support throughout the end-of-life process.

LICENSED VOCATIONAL NURSE

Licensed Vocational Nurses in hospice care work under the supervision of RNs and provide direct patient care, such as administering medications, monitoring vital signs, and assisting with activities of daily living.

CERTIFIED HOME HEALTH AIDES

Certified Home Health Aides provide compassionate support and assistance to hospice patients. They help with daily tasks such as bathing, grooming, and medication reminders. CHHAs also offer companionship, monitor vital signs, and report any changes in condition to ensure comfort.

MEDICAL SOCIAL WORKERS

Medical social workers provide emotional support, counseling, and assistance with accessing resources for patients and families. They help navigate healthcare systems and facilitate communication within the care team, aiming to enhance quality of life during the end-of-life journey.

HOSPICE CHAPLAINS

Hospice chaplains provide spiritual support for people of all faiths, planning service, and serve as a liaison between the family and clergy in the community.

BEREAVEMENT COUNSELORS

Bereavement counselors offer counseling, guidance, and resources to help navigate the grieving process, fostering healing and resilience during a difficult time.

HOSPICE VOLUNTEERS

Hospice volunteers provide companionship, run errands, assist with household tasks, and offer respite for caregivers.
